Re: Ray Hearn Golf Course Designs: An Introduction to Golf Course Design Seminar Series

I have enjoyed playing the game of golf for nearly 30 years, but in the last few years, I have began to critique and visualize changes I would have made in the design of many of the golf courses that I have played. My curiosity, of course, began long before I understood the design process and the fact that many courses in existence were not designed by professional golf course architects nor developed by experienced contractors. As my interest on the subject expanded, I began to focus my interest on golf course design and the architect's thought process and design elements that went into each of the courses that I played. Raymond Hearn has also "marked up" my graphic examples in a very positive manner to help illustrate how my design concepts can be further enhanced. I continue to be very motivated to write our assigned narrative for each aspect of the design process and I am eager to receive the thorough and timely review of my written and graphic design illustrations.
